Proposal:

Both panel and poster proposals must include:

- Title
- A 70-100 word Overview which will appear in the program booklet
- A 200-300 word Abstract that describes the research to be discussed, including design of the studies, findings (if relevant), and issues to be addressed
- Format of presentation, delineating how the 2 hour time block will be allocated
- The plan for allocation of presentation time to allow for discussion by the audience
- Presenter contact information and biographical sketches

Criteria for Selection:

- Proposals address issues related to the African American child in school
- Proposals reflect creative thinking
- Panels are composed of presenters who are on the path to research careers
- Proposals describe sound research ideas
- Proposals that are provocative and have the potential of promoting dialogue
- Proposals that coincide with the Mission of ISAAC and that will attract collaboration
